

Schedule of declarant property and income. *Key* to real or personal
property. Income as follows, the proceeds of the office of Register and Recorder
of Bedford County and Clerk of the Orphan Court of Bedford County
amounting to about two hundred and forty dollars per annum in fee payable by
the persons who have business in said Offices much of which are necessarily
credited; the duties of which said Offices respectively are necessarily performed
by a deputy as the declarant is unable from bodily infirmity to do more than
subscribe his name to any official paper or legal proceeding or to judge in
any judicial, depending before him as Register; that said declarant was appointed
to said Offices in the month of March 1821 and that said Offices are held
at the pleasure of the Executive of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania -
thence to and subscribed on the 6th day of
September 1822 in Bedford County.

certify that the foregoing schedule and the income thereon is an exact copy from
the records of said Court. And I do further certify that it is the opinion of
said Court that the total amount in value of all the property and income exhibited
in the aforesaid schedule is not worth one cent, in as much as the duties of Register
and Recorder and Clerk of the Orphan Court of Bedford County must necessarily
be discharged by Deputy whose compensation will amount to as much as the fees of
all these Offices and that the income arising from said Offices under present
circumstances and in the hands of the present incumbent is merely nominal.
That the declarant Benj^d Burch has but few Chalmers left here within of whom
is all in any way to support him. That all the real estate of the declarant
has been sold or thrown off at Marshall's sale and made into different parcels
of the said sale; that the declarant is in such indigent circumstances as to be
unable to support himself without the assistance of his Country.
