served in the Campaign under General Elliott  
against the Indians - And in Col. Brod-  
heads Campaign against the Indians, and  
was regularly discharged, that his discharge  
and papers respecting his said service were  
put into the hands of a man (he believes  
the name of Cline from Lancaster County)  
for the purpose of enabling him the said Cline  
to obtain the amount due by the United States  
to the deponent and he has never since received  
the papers or discharge from Cline nor has he  
any knowledge where they now are that from  
his reduced circumstances in life <sup>and infirmities</sup> he is in need  
of assistance from his Country for support  
that he hath no provision heretofore allowed  
him by the laws of the United States to his  
knowledge and if any such exists he doth  
hereby fully and entirely release the same to  
the United States.
