

At a Court of Common Pleas now holden at Bedford in and
for Bedford County of August (Term) 1820 before the honorable Charles
Houston Esquire, President and two Associates Judges of the said
Court which Comprehend part of the 4th Judicial District of Pennsyl-
vania on this day, to-wit, On Wednesday the ninth day of August 1820
personally appeared in open Court being a Court of record in and
for said County of Bedford, John Crossan aged sixty five years on the
twenty fifth day of April last, Resident in the said County of Bedford
who being first duly sworn according to laid Oaths on his Oath declares that
he served in the Revolutionary war Against the Common Enemy as stated
in his declaration forwarded to the War Department and on which
a Pension Certificate was issued to him the said John Crossan dated
the ninth day of April eight hundred and eighty seven signed J. C.
Calhoun Secretary of War. A. 4, 1768, and that he was a resident
Citizen of the United States to-wit, of the County of Bedford in the State
of Pennsylvania on the 18th day of March 1818. And that he hath not
since that time by gift Sale or in any manner disposed of his property
or any part thereof with an intent thereby to diminish it as to him
himself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled an Act
to provide for Continental persons engaged in the land and Naval service of
the United States in the Revolutionary war &c. &c. on the 18th day of
March 1818. And that he has not now has any person in trust for him
any property or securities, Contracts or debts due him now his heirs or assigns
other than what is contained in the annexed Schedule, except a pension
of forty Dollars per year granted him by the State of Pennsylvania and
the sum of \$1000 paid from the United States, that his wife Elizabeth Crossan
is the only part of his family living with him, that said Elizabeth is about
fifty two years of age, and that the said John Crossan hath no other child
now living in the State of Pennsylvania
