On this twentieth day of November  
1832 personally appeared before me Peter Schell an associate  
Judge of the several Courts of Common Pleas - Deceased Joseph R.  
in & for Bedford County Christopher Hart a resident of Colerain Town-  
ship County of Bedford & State aforesaid being seventy nine years who being  
duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in  
order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June  
9th 1832. That he enlisted into the Flying Camp about the last of  
June 1776 under the following named Officers, viz - Major Peter de Witt  
Col. Griffin, Lieut Col. George Rowen. Capt. Henry Haudman  
in Fred. <sup>W</sup> Rowen Maryland for the term of six months - That they  
marched from Frederick to Little York Town & thence to Lancaster  
& thence to Philad<sup>a</sup> - From Philad<sup>a</sup> they marched to Trenton, thence  
to Princeton, thence to Woodbridge & to Elizabethtown where they  
were joined by some other companies of their battalion. From  
Elizabethtown they marched to New York where they remained  
until the 16th day of September when they were compelled to  
evacuate it & the British took possession - After they left New  
York they marched eight miles & took possession of Morris's  
heights - Two days after, having removed their encampment  
a short distance, they had an engagement with the British
