Deponeeth and saith That he this Deponent Marched with his brother Jacob Hoyer for the summer of the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Seventy six. from the town of York in the County of York. and State of Pennsylvania in Captain Wrights Company of Militia. attached to the Regiment of Col. Skupper opposite to the city of New York. where my brother Jacob Hoyer enlisted in the service of his Country for five months. and after his time of service he the said Jacob Hoyer returned home to the town York in the County of York and State of Pennsylvania. This Deponent further saith that previous to his brother Jacob Hoyer enlisting in the service. he the Deponent and his brother Jacob Hoyer served each of them two months in Militia in the Company and Regiment Aforesaid.
