His father removed in to Bedford County when ^{this Applicant} was eight or nine years of age - to a place near where Huntingdon is situated - and that he lived in said County when he entered the service - after the war he went to Maryland & remained there 8 or 9 years - and came back to Bedford County when he has resided ever since. He was regularly enlisted in the service & rec^d. a discharge from Captⁿ Cluggan which was by some means destroyed and in 1818 he procured from his Captⁿ the affidavit he has annexed & never had a commission -

Applicant also states that Mr^s Piper and the Rev^d. Mr^s McClenny in his neighborhood can testify as to his character for veracity & their belief of his services as a soldier -
