Afterwards in January 1777. He went out in the militia as a first sergeant under the before named Officers excepting the Captain who was Francis Headdy.

He then lived in Sussex County aforesaid - and marched from there to Elizabethtown where they captured thirty six Hessian - They remained near Elizabethtown at the Scotch plains during the month for which they were called out & during which time they were generally engaged in scouting - After his return from Scotch plains he served five monthly tours the precise periods of which he cannot recollect - but they were all previous to the end of the year 1777, during said time he was at Round Island when it was ^{attacked} taken by the British -

Early in the year 1778 - applicant - joined a Volunteer Company commanded by Captⁿ Thomas Hails and remained in the same thirteen months at his own expense - (as did the rest of said Company) during which time they were engaged in scouting for Tories.

Also in the month of June 1779. He enlisted under Captⁿ George Ribbles in a company attached to Col. Taylor's Regiment for six months - That John Johnson was the Lieut^t & Westbrook Ensign - Two months of said time they were stationed at Elizabethtown & Hackensack - and the the remainder of the time at different places on the Delaware River - Having served the whole six months -
