

Beaford County, Pa.

That a Court of Common Pleas was holden at Beaford in and for Beaford County of August term 1820 before the Honorable Charles Huston Esquire Justice and his Associates Justices of said Court which Compose part of the 1st Judicial District of Pennsylvania, on the day, to wit, on Tuesday the 8th day of August 1820. Personally appeared in Open Court being a Court of Record in and for said County John M. Bracka Esq. Sixty eight years on the 1st day of July last, past, resident in the said County of Beaford, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War three years and eight months, in a Company first Commanded by Captain Frederick Vassler, then by Captain Robert Gregg afterwards by Lieutenant Griffey in the 5th Pennsylvania Regiment Commanded by Colonel Francis Johnson of the 1st Regiment Brigade of General Wayne's Division on the Continental Establishment in the Revolutionary War, against the Common Enemy all which as Dependent believes was the fact in his Origin and in bearing date as Dependent believes on the 2^d day of May A.D. 1778 and on which a pension Certificate issued to Dependent dated the 23^d day of October 1809. Signed J. C. Calhoun Secretary of War Book Number 15. 1146. and Dependent doth also swear that he was a Resident Citizen of the United States to wit, of the said County of Beaford State of Pennsylvania on the 18th day of March 1818. And that he hath not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of his property or any part thereof, with an intent thereby to be exempted it as to bring himself within the provision of an Act of Congress entitled and act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 8th day of March 1815. And that he has not nor has any person in trust for him any property or securities, contracts, or debts due him nor has he any claim other than what is contained in the annexed Schedule by him subscribed.
