to his residence in Loudon County aforesaid & afterwards  
in the month of Aug<sup>r</sup> or September 1781. He again volunteered  
in the same company under the same Captain, Lieutenant  
& Ensign & the same Colonel & marched as a Sergeant in  
said company. That they marched from Loudon County  
aforesaid to Fredericksburgh & to the combined army then  
at Gloster Court House, that the day after their arrival  
there was a skirmish with the enemy. That he remained  
with said army doing duty in said Corps until after the  
surrender of Lord Cornwallis, & then assisted in guarding the  
Prisoners surrendered at ~~York~~ as far as Holands  
ferry. That after his term of service had expired he was  
with the rest of said company discharged at Holands  
ferry. That his said service at both periods exceeded  
six months as he verily believes as a volunteer as aforesaid.

That said applicant hereby relinquishes  
every claim whatever to a Pension, or annuity except  
the present and delays that his name is not on  
the Pensioners Roll of the agency of any State.

the 18<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1758 in Sussex County New Jersey  
that he lived in Loudon County Virginia from the time  
he left the service until the year 1782. When he removed

That he never had a written discharge nor did  
did he know of any of the messes receiving a discharge  
and that he believes each term of his said service was  
three months. He has a record of his age as made by.
