

with the Camp Fever he was then removed to Philadelphia where he lay nine weeks with a Brother of his. and on the Twenty sixth of March 1847 this Deponent got his discharge from Capt Joseph Medhamp in the Town of Wilmington this Deponent was at that time unable to do any longer in consequence of the Fever or he would have engaged in the Service again. The time for which he was one year as expressed was on the Continent that he labored under the said Joseph Medhamp and Robert Kirkwood and Genl Lock Anderson on Long John Core - Deponent had his discharge for twelve years among some old papers by which means it was lost without this Deponent's knowledge and Deponent further saith that he has never had any portion allowed him by any law of the United States to his knowledge and should he be entitled to any under any former law of the Congress he hereby fully relinquishes the same to the United States. and Deponent further saith that from his reduced circumstances he desires the aid of his Country for support
