
Andrew McPherran was a Revolutionary soldier and served under ~~Captain~~ Thomas Church, 4th Battalion, Continental Line, Col. Anthony Wayne commanding. Andrew McPherran was a native of York county and was pensioned by the United States Government in about 1818, and died in Huntingdon county in June, 1829.

I have been trying to get a list of the names of his children, which perhaps would be attached to his application for a pension which was granted to him between the date of 1800 and 1818.

Will you kindly let me know what the cost of an investigation would be, so that I may be able to obtain the names of his children. I believe one of his children, probably born in Huntingdon county, was my grandmother, Maty.
