mountain and returned home late in the
fall after a service of at least 4 summer months
without being in any engagement - that they were
ordered by their superiors after returning home to keep
in readiness to march again when called on,
that they accordingly held themselves in readiness
until the next spring, when they were again
called on by the same officers and marched
upon the waters of the red stone and ranged
between the Glack and Laurel Hills about
and at least six months, and returned home
and after remaining a week we were marched
over Lack Mountain after Indians, where
they ^{we} came across a party of Indians and
killed ^{one} the ^{rest} of them, & took one white man, ^{2 wounded} and
continued carrying & spying at least three months, ^{longer} when
they returned home and ^{were} discharged - That
he was afterwards sent in scouting companies
divers times as necessity required, & was thus
engaged at least six months longer - This
deponent further states upon oath that cannot collect
from infirmity of body and the consequent decay of
memory the precise length of his service but from
the best of his recollection he was engaged in actual
service as above stated at least two years and
