On this sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eighteen, before me the Subscriber, one of the Associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, in and for the County of Huntingdon and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Personally appears Adam Stonebraker aged about Sixty eight years, Resident in Huntingdon County & Commonwealth aforesaid, Who being by me first duly sworn, according to laws doth on his Oath, make the following declarations in order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & Naval Service of the United States in the revolutionary War" That he the said Adam Stonebraker enlisted in the Town of York in Pennsylvania and County of York, in the Company commanded by Captain William Hives, in the German Regiment of Pennsylvania, commanded by Lt. Kneucker, in General Muhlensberg's Brigade in the Month of August, in the year One thousand seven hundred and seventy six; That he continued to serve in the said Corps in the service of the United States, until the Month of August in the year One thousand seven hundred and seventy nine, when he was discharged by Capt. Bunner, of said Regiment from service above the town of Sunberry near Wyoming in Pennsylvania, which discharge he lost by being thrown from his Horse into Senecaque creek where it became wet and rubbed into pieces before he attended to have it dried, That he was in the Battles of Trenttown at the taking the Hessians, Princeton, Red Bank, Germantown where he was shot through the Leg with a Buckshot, and in the Battle of Monmouth besides the Skirmish at Couches Bridge in the State of Delaware & other Skirmishes, And that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, having lost his hearing by hardship he states in the Army. And that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. That he hath no Pension heretofore allowed him by the laws of the United States, to his knowledge & if any such exists he doth hereby fully & entirely release the same to the United States.
