

When, he gave the same to Capt. Andrew Mann  
then a member of the Pennsylvania Legislature  
to enquire about his land as he understood  
that he had a right to being a donation  
from the State of Pennsylvania but was informed  
that he was not entitled to the same  
not having served five years. & the said  
discharge was never returned to him.

That after his said discharge  
he returned to Northampton County, Pennsylvania  
& marched as a substitute in the Militia  
against the Indians two tours of duty of  
duty each this was in the summer of fall  
of 1778. & he was under the command of  
Captain Belmire - They marched to the  
branch of Susquehanna - dependent further  
that he served one other tour of two months  
as a forward (not as a substitute) against the  
Indians as forward.

The said applicant, further  
states that he hereby relinquishes every claim  
whatsoever to a pension or any annuity except  
the present, and he declares, that his name  
is not on the pension roll of any agency  
known to & subscribed this 28th day of November
