a two Months term in that capacity in June 1781 quartered
at Freds, Stout's Belfast Township then Bethel) Capt. Daves com-
manded the Company Marched to Peppers in 3^d County of Bedford
served there five weeks then Marched to Bedford and there joined
an Army composed of Militia & Volunteers (Capt. Daves remained
at Peppers with a small number of his Company) the command de-
volved on 3^d Applicant being then Lieutenant of 3^d Company and
marched under Col. Davison (Col. Martin & Capt. Beard accom-
panied the party) traversed a Wilderness in search of hostile
Indians crossed the Allegheny Mountain the head Waters of the Conne-
quogus & Blacklick crossed the dividing ridge between 3^d Waters &
that of the Susquehanna River thence to Chest creek thence to
Clearfield crossed the Allegheny Mountain to ~~the town~~
& thence to Peppers found no Indians, the Country unexplored
was uninhabited, the term of service having expired was
Discharged & returned home in Bedford County has since
joined in some scouting excursions none of them for more than
six or seven days at a time after the Indians during the
revolutionary war, that he has no documentary evidence of
his service and that he knows of no person whose testimony he
can procure who can testify to his service.
