Dear Madam:

You are advised that it appears from the records of this bureau that Warrant Number 2640 for two hundred acres of bounty land was issued April 5, 1794, to Margaret McFarren, administratrix, on account of the services of Samuel McFarren, Lieutenant in the Pennsylvania Line, War of the Revolution.

There are no further data on file in regard to him due to the destruction of papers in such claims when the War Office was burned in 1800.

The relationship of Margaret McFarren to the soldier is not shown.

The above is the only soldier named Samuel McFarren, under any spelling of the surname, who served with the Pennsylvania Troops, found on the Revolutionary War records of this bureau and said records fail to afford any information in regard to Conrad Speelman, Abraham Dull or Peter Walborn.
