On this 17th day of May 1811
personally appeared before Joseph Adams Esquire one of the
Appellate Judges, in and for the County aforesaid, Robert Parr
a resident of ^(Parr) Township, in the County of Huntingdon
and State of Pennsylvania aged eighty four years, who being
first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the
following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the pro-
vision made by the act of Congress, passed June 7th 1832 -

That he entered the service of the
United States under the following named officers, and
served as herein after stated. That in the month of July 1776
he volunteered in the Militia of Pennsylvania for a two
months tour, under the command and of Capt. ^{John} McElharrow
who then resided in Cumberland (now Juni-
ata County Pennsylvania, John Davidson was Colonel
and lived in a new parish. General Robert Lee was
then in the chief command - we all collected together at
(Old Town) now Lewis town, then Cumberland now Mifflin
County Pennsylvania from thence we were marched to
Carlisle in said County of Cumberland, where we remained
a short time, thence we were ordered to Lancaster, and
thence we proceeded to Philadelphia, thence we were
marched to New York, ~~by the way~~ through the State of
New Jersey - after arriving at ~~the~~ we heard the firing
at the battle of Long Island - after the two months had
expired, the time for which we volunteered, we were dismissed
