

- fed, and permitted to return home - his Officers to this town  
were Captain John McElhutton, 1st Lieutenant James Adams  
John Davidson was our Colonel, Robert Dod was our General.

That in the latter part of the year 1776, Depment went out as  
a substitute for his brother David - for a two months term of  
Service, under the command of Captain James Purdy, and  
marched to Carlisle in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania  
thence we marched to Lancaster Pennsylvania - some of the  
Keesians, were then in prison at this place, who had been  
taken at Trenton New Jersey - from thence we went on to  
Philadelphia, and proceeded over into New Jersey to  
Princeton, and lay in the College at said place - After  
the two months had elapsed we were dismissed, the Officers  
to this town were Colonel Frederick Mattle, General Putman  
and Captain James Purdy -

That in the year 1778 he marched as Lieutenant in a  
company commanded by Captain Samuel Holliday for  
a two months term of Service - and marched to Carlisle  
Pennsylvania, thence we proceeded to Lancaster, and  
remained there about a week, from thence we pursued  
General Washington's army as they lay at the Bull's Point  
from thence we proceeded to Duxbury Bucks County -  
After the service of the two months we were dismissed, and  
returned home - Colonel Isaac Brown and Co-  
lonel Arthur Buchanow were our Colonels, General  
Lacey of Bucks County was the Chief Commanding Officer -
