Peter Brecher being duly sworn before me the undersigned an approved judge of the Court of Common Pleas for and of the said County, doth declare and say that he enlisted in May 1778 (See his his Oath of Office &c hereto attached) under Capt Richard Lindley in the County of Berks for the sixth Pennsylvania Regiment Commanded by Col: Richard Hampton for the term of Three Years or during the War during which I was Detached with in the British Government the Battle of Stony Point the white plains the Battle of Long Island, deponent was and in the said Regiment in the Revolutionary War and served to Jersey and was at the taking of the Ships at the Battle of Trenton, Deponent doth that he served the term of his enlistment with in a few Weeks for the American Revolutionary War of the said Regiment (See his Discharge attached to this Sheet of Paper)

and Deponent further saith that from his reduced circumstances in Life he needs the assistance of his Country for Support
