Butt Remembers that on the fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lords one Thousand Eight hundred and Eighteen Before me David Stewart one of the associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Huntingdon in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Personally appeared Matthew Colabough of the Borough of Huntingdon in the said County of Huntingdon and a resident Citizen of the United States, and being duly sworn according to law doth and did depose and say that on or about the month of June or July in the year of our Lords one Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy five he entered into the Army of the United Colonies raised for the defence of American Liberty, and for repelling every hostile invasion thereof as a private Soldier in a company of Riflemen under Captain Michael Fripp in the Town of Hagerstown and State of Maryland - That in the same year he was marched to Boston ~~and remained there~~ whilst building the fort at Bunkers Hill and afterwards marched to Staten Island, where, in the month of June or July in the year of our Lords one Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy six he was honorably discharged Having served in the Army of the United Colonies afterwards the Army of the United States of America for ~~that~~ during the Term of one year - That his discharge was Lost by accident, but in what manner he cannot now Tell - That he hath no Pension heretofore allowed him by the Laws of the United States to his Knowledge, and if any such exist he doth hereby fully and entirely release the same to the United States - That he is now about Seventy
