At a Court of Common Pleas
holden this day (to wit, sixteenth day of August 1820 at
Huntingdon in and for the said County (being a Court
of records) Personally came James Dunker who being
duly sworn deposed and saith and on his oath
aforesaid doth declare and say that he entered as
a Soldier in the Revolutionary War for the Term
of three years in a Company Commanded by Captain
William Myer in the Regiment called the Germian
Battalion Commanded by Colonel Husaker, and
after Colonel Welkner as set forth in his declaration
originally made the date of which he doth not now
recollect but believes it was some time in April 1818
which declaration was forwarded to the war department
and on which a pension Certificate was issued to the
said James Dunker dated the 14th of April 1818
Signed J. C. Calhoun Secretary of the War which
Certificate is numbered 2909 and is in possession of the
said James Dunker who in pursuance of the act of
Congress of the 20th of May 1820 makes the following decla-
ration on oath (to wit) I James Dunker do swear
that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on
the 28th day of March 1818 and that I have not since
that time by gift Sale or in any other manner
disposed of my property or any part thereof with an
intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself
within the provision of an act of Congress entitled an
act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land
and Naval Service of the United States in the
Revolutionary War passed the 18th day of March 1818 that
I have not nor has any person or persons in trust for me any
property or securities contracts or debts due me nor has
I any Income other than which is contained in the
Schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed the said
