

Whereas Hugh Glen Entered into the Services of the United States in the year Seventy Eight and Served to the End of the War between the United States and Great Britain who served under continental Establishment in the Eight Regiment in the Pennsylvania line Now be it known that I Thomas Ennal and Mary My Wife Daughter of said Glen who is now deceased do by these presents Nominate and appoint Joseph Stokely of the County of Westmoreland our absolute attorney for us and in our Names to obtain of the United States all such Land County as may be considered due to said Glen in consideration of his said Services as a Soldier during the war Now hereafterly understood that I Thomas Ennal and Mary My Wife for a valuable consideration to us in hand paid by the said Joseph Stokely the Receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge we the said Thomas Ennal and Mary My Wife do by these presents order and direct the Honorable Secretary of War to issue to and in the Name of the said Joseph Stokely all such Land County as may be considered due to said Glen for his military services giving authority in and about the premises in testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and Seals Dated September the 14th 1812.
