

to march against the enemy. This applicant was permitted by his captain to return home and there to remain under the aforesaid requisitions and subject to the orders before specified. This applicant was not afterwards however called upon to march against the enemy or take the field or Garrison during the remaining month of his draft viz. the month of August 1779. That this applicant served the said periods above named as a private soldier and served in all his revolutionary services a period of ten months of actual service, in the field and garrison (and one other month as a drafted minute man or militiaman) and the applicant further says that he does not now know positively whether there is any living witness or any documentary evidence ^{rather than by the sworn affidavit} that can be produced by which he can prove the above services or any part thereof, and that he was not at any time engaged in any civil pursuit but was entirely and wholly devoted to the Army as above mentioned.

Interrogatories

- First Where and in what year were you born?
Answer I was born in Germany in the year 1758 and was emigrated to the United States during my infancy.
- Second Have you any record of your age and if so where is it?
Answer I have no record of my age when I became twenty one years of age my father told me I was free and I know my age from that fact.
- Third Where were you living when called into the service where have you lived since the Revolutionary War and where do you now live?
Answer When I was called into the service I lived in the vicinity of Chambersburg in the County of Franklin and State of Pennsylvania and since the Revolutionary War I lived in Franklin County Penna. and in Huntingdon County Penna. where I have lived for fifty years past.
- Fourth How were you called into the service, were you drafted did you volunteer or were you a substitute and if a substitute for whom?
Answer I was drafted and served for the periods as I have above stated.
- Fifth State the names of the Regular officers who were with the troops where you served, such Continental Regiments as you can recollect and the general circumstances of your service.
