Personally appeared before me
the undersigned a justice of the peace in
and for the county aforesaid, Samuel Henry,
of Barree Township, County and State aforesaid
and who made his declaration, in
order to obtain a pension under the act of
7th June A.D. 1832, before the Court of Common
Pleas of the County aforesaid, Hon. Thos. Ben-
side being President and Joseph McBune and
Joseph Adams associate judges of the said Court,
and after being duly sworn, according to law do
depose and say, that by reason of old age and
the consequent loss of memory, he cannot swear posi-
tively as to the precise length of his service but accor-
ding to the best of his recollection he served not less
than the periods mentioned below and in the
following grades - For two months at least I
served as a volunteer, as stated in my declaration
made on the day seventeenth day of August A.D. 1832
the second time I acted as Captain, under a com-
mission which is lost and was in actual service for
three years, either in garrison or in the field as stated in
my declaration and I received a second commission
as captain dated 10th May 1780 and served or was in ac-
tual service till the close of the war, either in garrison
or in the field - I served all the foregoing time with an
embodied corps called into service by competent au-
thority, at the places mentioned in my declaration. Dur-
ing the time the said services were performed I was not
employed in any civil pursuit and for the said ser-
vices I claim a pension.
