It is remembered that on the fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lords one thousand eight hundred and eighteen before me David Stewart one of the associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Huntingdon in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania personally appeared John Hutchison of the Township of Barree Township in the said County of Huntingdon and a resident Citizen of the United States and being duly sworn according to law, doth and did declare and say that he entered into the Army of the United States raised for the defence of American Liberty and for repelling every hostile invasion thereof <sup>as a volunteer</sup> in a company of Riflemen under Captain Parr in the first Pennsylvania Regiment of Riflemen Commanded by Colonel Hand and remained under the command of Captain Parr until Colonel Morgan got his choice of the Pennsylvania Riflemen when he chose Captain Parr who went with Morgan and Captain McClellan was then appointed to the command of Captain Parr's company about that time General Wayne took the command and Colonel Chambers commanded in Hand's place he being advanced that he was in the Battle of Quibbletown in the Jerseys, Battle of Brandywine, Battle of Germantown, Battle at the Paoli where he received a wound in the thigh with a Bayonet. Battle of Long Island where he received a slight wound in the Breast, Battle of Monmouth and the Battle of Honey Point - That he served in the Army of the said United Colonies, afterwards the United States of America for and during the term of six years and six months, when he was honorably discharged by Captain McClellan, Colonel Chambers and General Anthony Wayne.
