That his discharge became lost or omitted in
a manner unknown to the Exponent that
he hath no Pensions heretofore allowed him
by the Laws of the United States, to his know-
ledge, and if any such exist he doth hereby
fully and entirely release the same to the United
States - That he is now upwards of sixty four
years of age, and that by reason of his reduced
Circumstances in life needs assistance from
his Country for support.
