Before me the Subscriber one of the Associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County aforesaid in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Person-ally appeared John Irvine late a Soldier in the Revolutionary War with Great Britain and a Citizen of Frankstown township in the County of Huntingdon aforesaid in which he doth reside formerly of Chester County Pennsylvania and after being duly sworn according to law by me he doth depose and say that he was duly enlisted in the month of January in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & seventy six for one year with Captain James Moore of Chester County aforesaid in the fourth Pennsylvania Regiment commanded by G. Anthony Wayne in the Pennsylvania line in the continental establishment, and that he continued for one year in the same Company. That in the Winter of the year One thousand seven hundred and seventy seven he enlisted with Captain Thomas Church in the same Regiment he had served the year before for three years, and served ~~the~~ three years and at the expiration thereof was discharged by Col. Francis Johnston, who had succeeded to the Command of the Regiment in place of G. Anthony Wayne who was promoted. That he this deponent is at present sixty six years of age, without any Family and never hath been married, that he hath no estate of any kind equal to his support, and by reason of his advanced age & infirmities is unable to support himself by Labour, and stands in need of Assistance from his Country for Support, and that he hath no pension heretofore allowed him by the laws of the United States to his knowledge, and if any such exists, he doth hereby fully and entirely release the same to the United States.
