On this 16th day of August 1834

personally appeared before Thomas Bunsell Esquire, and
Joseph W. Burns and Joseph Adams Esquires his
appointed, Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Hun-
tingdon County, aforesaid - William Johnston, a resident
of Huntingdon County, aged seven ty
years who being sworn according to law, doth
make the following declaration, in order to obtain
the benefit of the provisions made by the act of Congress
passed June 18th 1832 -

That he entered the service of the
United States under the following named officers, and
served as herein after stated. That in the latter part of
July 1798 he went out as a substitute for Joseph Ordway
in the company commanded by Captain Edwards
for a four months term in the Militia of Pennsylvania
that he joined the company at Washington
County, Pennsylvania - we commenced our
march, and proceeded down the Ohio River, until we ar-
rived at the Falls of said Ohio River, when we continued a
short time, we from thence were marched to Fort Mifflin
where we remained four days - we then continued
our march down the river Ohio, until we arrived at the
mouth of the Kentucky River, from thence we were marched
down the said river to a place called Louisville, we
