

remained here a considerable time, after wards we were
marched up the said river, until we came to the head
waters of the Monongahela river, at which place the four
months the time for which I went out having expired,
was dismissed, I did not receive a better discharge
Our Officers to this time were Colonel Gashanah
Major Captain Edward Stuart, 1st Lieutenant John
Joseph O'Donnell, Esq. Ensign Baldwin Colburn, also Captain
Samuel Whaley, 1st Lieutenant James Paul

In the month of May 1782, I volunteered
under Captain John Peason for a term of service during
the year we came to garrison at Washington in York
County of Washington, and were marched to Wells But
at the Crook creek, we remained here a short time, we
from thence crossed the river, and were marched to the
"Mingo Bottom" a place where there had been an Indian
town. at which place we continued a considerable time,
an object in continuing at this place was for recruits
which were daily expected. we from thence were marched
to the Middle Mearian town, we staid here a short time,
we were then ordered to the Upper Mearian town, and
from this place we were marched to Mocheraw John's
Lake thence we proceeded out to an Indian town
called I think, *Chahajintle* we from here were marched to the
plains of Sandusky, where we were attacked by the
Indians, we had ten men killed, and we left about
forty or fifty wounded on the field of action - And owing
to the Indians being more numerous than we were
