Dear Madam:

The data found herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, S. 39822, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Alexander King.

The date and place of this soldier's birth are not shown in the claim, nor are the names of his parents stated.

While a resident of Chester County, Pennsylvania, Alexander King enlisted at New London Cross Roads, Pennsylvania, January 10, 1776 and served one year in Captain Henry Darby's company in Colonel Haslet's Delaware regiment, and was in the battles of Long Island, White Plains, where he received a bayonet wound in the hand, and battle of Trenton. He enlisted in the spring of 1777 and served as corporal and sergeant in Captains William Henderson's and Benjamin Fishburn's companies, Colonel William Butler's Fourth Pennsylvania regiment, was in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown, was in Sullivan's Expedition against the Indians, and was discharged in January, 1781.

He was allowed pension on his application executed, April 14, 1818, then a resident of Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania. He was also pensioned by the state of Pennsylvania, for his services in the War of the Revolution.
