remained there two years he then joined the  
Army again and remained in the Army  
during the war and was discharged by Genl  
Richard Butler which discharge he sent to  
Harrisburg to get assistance from the State of  
Pennsylvania and he has not seen it since  
Deponant saith that he never knew of any document  
allowed to him by any act of Congress of the  
United States but should any such exist
