before the honourable Charles Keeton Esq. President and David Stewart and Joseph McBurne Esquires associates being as Court of Records declared such by act of Assembly of Pennsylvania on the 10th day of January A D 1821 residents in Huntingdon County aged 79 years and upwards Personally appeared in open Court Samuel Lewis who being duly sworn doth depose and say that he is the same Samuel Lewis to whom a Certificate of Pension was granted at the War Office of the United States dated 2nd February 1819 No 6278 and he doth on his oath aforesaid declare and say that he served as a Soldier in the Revolutionary War as follows For six years four Months and twenty two days and was discharged at Carlisle in Pennsylvania the 27th September 1783 from the 5th Regiment of the Pennsylvania line and was rewarded with the badge of Merit for his faithful services and the said Samuel Lewis do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 15th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled the act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not now nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or Debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed
