 but on the way to Monmouth this deponent took  
 sick at a place called Sowerland in the State of New  
 Jersey and was sent to Princeton Hospital where he  
 remained sick for about two months, he then joined  
 the Army and marched up the Mohawk river after  
 the Indians, at this time Colonel <sup>Van</sup> Ransselaer was  
 then commander, he remained up the Mohawk river  
 until his nine months were expired and he was  
 discharged and returned home - that in the summer  
 of 1770 he again enlisted for the term of six  
 months as deponent with other marched under  
 Colonel Mackintosh to Albany & from there  
 marched up the Mohawk river after the Indians  
 and remained there until his term expired when  
 he was discharged.

 The year I cannot state but that it was in 1754 in  
 the County of Westchester - came to the City of New York  
 in 1773.
2. Have you any record of your age; and if so when is it?  
 An - I have no record of my age.
3. When were you living when called into service; were  
 you drafted or upon volunteer, or were you a substitute?  
 when have you lived since the revolutionary war, and where  
 do you now live? I was living in York County  
 State of New York - in 1791. I lived from  
 York County to Montgomery in Pennsylvania then to Centre  
 and then to Huntington County to Cass Valley  
 in Westchester four years & passed lead in that Valley  
 in the French Revolution for seven years. I now  
 live at Union Farm in Westchester in Huntington County.
4. How were you called into service; were you drafted, did you  
 volunteer, or were you a substitute? and if a substitute  
 for whom? I voluntarily listed for seven months  
 listed or also for seven months. I served  
 as stated before.
