Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Captain John Marshall of Pennsylvania.

The records furnished herein are of the only soldiers of that name, who served as captains, with the Pennsylvania troops, found on file in the Revolutionary War records of this office.

The date and place of birth of John Marshall are not stated, nor are the names of his parents shown, in the papers on file in the above noted pension claim.

John Marshall served from March 14, 1776, two months and nineteen days as captain in Colonel Samuel Miles' Second Battalion of Pennsylvania Riflemen; and from October 24, 1776 he was captain of a company of foot in Colonel Walter Stewart's Thirteenth Pennsylvania Regiment, was wounded in the battle of Brandywine, and served until in November or December, 1783, when in consequence of his brother, Patrick, having been killed by the enemy and the charge of a large family devolving on him, he retired from the service.

John Marshall was allowed pension on his application executed May 8, 1818, then sixty-nine years of age and living in Washington County, Pennsylvania.
