Huntingdon County, Pa. On this 18th day of August 1820
Personally appeared in open Court said Court being a Court
of Records in & for said County in the District aforesaid, Andrew
Sands aged 56 years & upwards who being duly sworn according
to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in
order to obtain the provision made by the Act of Congress
of the 18th day of March 1818 and the 1st of May 1820 that he the
said Andrew Sands enlisted on the seventh day of June 1777 in
the State of Pennsylvania in the Company Commanded
by Captain Holliday in the 1st Regiment of the Pennsylvania
Line commanded by Colonel Chambers & served in said
Regiments until the 13th August 1783 against the Common
Enemy in the Revolutionary war on the Continental
Establishment that he continued to serve in the said
Corps until the said 13th day of August 1783 when he was
discharged as will appear by his said discharge exhibited to
the Court aforesaid that during the time he served as a
Soldier aforesaid he was in the Battles of Brandywine
Germanstown Monmouth Stony Point at the Siege of
York when Cornwallis was taken at the Green Springs & in
several skirmishes with the Enemy that he has no other
evidence now in his possession but his said discharge
and in pursuance of the Act of the first of May 1820 the
said Andrew Sands makes oath as follows Viz I
Andrew Sands do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen
of the United States on the 18th day of March one thousand
eight hundred and eighteen & that I have not since that
time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my prop-
erty or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish
it as to bring myself within the Provisions of an Act of Congress
Entitled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in
the land and Naval Service of the United States in the
Revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March one
thousand eight hundred and eighteen & that I have
