-ed by Captain William Hyper or Heiser in the German Regiment or Battalion  
under the command of Co. Housreker and continued a second Lieutenant  
in the said Company for upwards of ten Months on the Continental estab-

-tinued a soldier in the said Company during all the time Lieutenant  
Adam Smith served as a Lt. of said Company and for some time
