

County aforesaid; it appears to my satisfaction, that the said Adam Smith did
serve in the Revolutionary War, as stated in the preceding declaration, against the
Common enemy, and that he is poor, and stands in need of the assistance of his
Country for support. And I now transmit the proceedings and testimony
taken and ~~had~~ before me, to the Hon. the Secretary for the Department
of War, pursuant to the directions of the aforesaid Act of Congress.
