At a Court of Common Pleas now holden for Huntingdon County said Court being a Court of Records in and for said County on this seventeenth day of August 1820 personally appeared in open Court as aforesaid Adam Smith aged sixty seven years and upwards who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows that he entered the army in the year seventeen hundred and seventy six as a Second Lieutenant of the Company Commanded by Captain William Flyer in a Regiment Commanded by Colonel Housaker Called the Germin Regiment in the United States Service that said Regiment was composed partly of Marylanders and partly of Pennsylvanians and that he served as a Second Lieutenant as aforesaid in the Revolutionary War against the Common Enemy for sixteen months or thereabouts that declarant made application for a pension as deponant believes on 11th day of June 1819 and received a pension Certificate dated the 26th day of July 1819 signed J C Calhoun Secretary of War and numbered 12,869. which said pension Certificate states his pension to commence on the 11th day of June 1819

And the said Adam Smith makes oath as follows I Adam Smith do Solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift Sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress Entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities Contracts or debts due to me nor have I any other Income than what is contained in the annexed Schedule and by me subscribed Declarant also states that he is a Carpenter by Trade but
