Dear Sir:

You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 40455, that Adam Smith, while residing in Hagerstown, Maryland, was appointed in May, 1776, 2<sup>nd</sup> lieutenant in Captain William Heyser's company, Colonel Haussegger's German Regiment; was in the battles of Trenton, Princeton, and three skirmishes near Maidenhead, New Jersey, and resigned his commission, August 1, 1777.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 11, 1819, at which time he was living in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania, and was aged sixty-six years.

In 1820 he stated that his children were "all of age"; their names are not given, nor is the name of his wife shown.
