On this seventeenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared in open court of common Pleas of the county of Huntingdon before the Honourable Charles Houston Esquire President and David Stewart and Joseph W. Cune Esquires associate Judges of the said court being a court of Records for the said district Thomas Smith aged sixty two years resident in Barre Township in the said county of Huntingdon in the above district who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows that he enlisted with Captain Thomas Kempton in the year and was taken prisoner at the Battle of Red Bank, and suffered three years imprisonment that he belonged to the Regiment commanded by Colonel John Murray of the Pennsylvania line that his original declaration is dated the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and that the number of his Pension Certificate is 5,099 and do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sales or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the eighteenth of March 1818 and that I have not any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed & by me subscribed
