Questions by the court -

1st When and in what year were you born?

Answer - I was born in Philadelphia, in the state of Pennsylvania, and as I always understood on the 22^d day of September in the year one thousand seven hundred & fifty two.

2^d Have you any record of your age and if so where is it?

Answer - I have not any record of my age, it was in a bible, which my uncle got into possession in Bucks County many years ago, I now know nothing of it.

3^d When were you living when called into review, when have you lived since the Revolutionary war, and where do you now live?

Answer - I was living in the said township of Barrow county of Bedford, now Huntingdon; I have been living since the Revolutionary war in the said county of Huntingdon & the adjoining county of Mifflin, & I now live in Shirley township in said county of Huntingdon.

4th How were you called into review, were you drafted, did you volunteer, or were you a substitute?

Answer - I was drafted for the first time, and though I joined by a writ of enlistment the remaining term, yet I got no bounty & might have been called a volunteer, I was never a substitute.
